Outcomes

Resiliency – People will be better able to cope with the stress of their daily lives.

Improved skills and capacities—People served by the network will be connected to training and educational opportunities including the use of the Internet and other resources.

Assumptions

We live in an information saturated society. Information is abundant, but time, attention, and skills to take advantage of this are scarce.

There is a large digital divide in Philadelphia.

Many people in Philadelphia have limited access or ability to use the Internet.

Human service and government programs are not able to meet all of Philadelphia's information and resource needs.

We need to work together to build trust among many neighbors in Philadelphia.

Social capital can be developed through the formalization of helping networks.

People benefit when diverse networks are connected.

Join The Network

If you find yourself offering to help the people around you with information, or connections to other people, you might like to **join our network** of helpful people.

The Community Magic Network invites participation by anyone who wishes to be helpful to others.

Free Training

To begin, free training and coaching is being offered in the use of **two specific Internet resources**:

- 1) **Freecycle** is an online and email service that offers people an opportunity to give away or find free goods. If you need something, you can find it or ask for it on Freecycle.
- 2) Craigslist is like the classified section of a newspaper. It offers anyone the opportunity to create or view a broad range of listings for things like jobs, housing, and goods. It's possible to get great deals on furniture, toys, cars, appliances, and just about anything else. The Craigslist employment listings are very comprehensive. In certain cases, employers pay to advertize their openings, but job seekers don't pay anything. People who want to offer freelance services can post their skills and service offerings on Craigslist for free. It's a great way to drum up customers for a small business.

"Ask Me" Buttons

Network participants who have shown skill at using **Craigslist** and **Freecycle** and are willing to help others with this skill, will receive an "**Ask Me... I like being helpful**"

button. The buttons will be both reward for offering this skill to other people and a way to announce to friends, relatives, and community members that the button wearer is offering to provide help.
